














• University faculty and students from the Southern region of the island have been recently engaged through diverse initiatives.




The Museum has provided free of charge a welcoming space to our community groups in the Annex building.

The Museum is building new relationships with Ponce schools and offering free art workshops to specific underserved and vulnerable communities in the city. The museum has reactivated its membership program through activities that reinforce mission-motivated giving.



It has strengthened relationships with artists in Ponce. A new exhibition series facilitates connections between artists and the collection and documents their creative process through conversations and videos.

What remains to be done:


- Maintain foundation relationships and build new relationships

- Interpret European art through a post-colonial Puerto Rican world view
- Forefront dialogues around art and culture in Ponce and Puerto Rico

What remains to be done:

- Repair, reconstruct, and retrofit Edward Durell Stone building
- Actively market the Museo and its programs locally and internationally
- Expand curatorial program with local and international guest curators
- Build a collaborative partnership with an arts organization in the Caribbean
- Organize an annual festival of Puerto Rican arts and ideas with local partners
